In 1934 Fred Liston built the Liston's that still stands today on Old North Road (with a few additions). At the end of Prohibition and the rising popularity of the "horseless Carriages" Fred opened the bar with 4 stool and a candy counter, ice cream,too!.

Gasoline soon was available outside while customers fueled up at the bar and caught up on local politics.. Fred's entrepreneurial spirit blossomed and he soon added a garage to the original structure. Now, you could get your Model A serviced while having some liquid refreshments.

Fred was also the original owner of Liston's Propane which he later sold to Al George of Adams somewhere in the 1960'S [according to George] which is now operated by his sons as George Propane in Goshen.

Fred was a self made man especially polite to women and children. Through the years there have been several new owners of Liston's . Following Fred his wife Joan ran it for a short time, then John and Irene Parkinson, and currently Steve and Diane Magargal. Steven is a native of Worthington and Liston's is still a place to go and meet family and friends and have a good meal. [now its Beer for the Dads and Candy for the kids]
